EXCLUSIVE CLUB

Drinking at Ronin makes you feel like you stumbled into James Bond's man cave. There's nothing marking the dark-gray building save a wooden door handle. Inside, a mere 14 thick leather bar stools line a long bar. Japanese influences extend from the refined decor to the copious whiskey selection to menu delicacies. REFINED IMBIBEMENT

Angel's Share, a dark, warm, British whiskey lounge, is tucked on the second floor of a building. It's been a clubhouse for booze connoisseurs since 2010, with more than 100 dark spirits you won't find anywhere else. The 17-year Glenlivet is served straight from the barrel using a tool called a whiskey thief. The cocktails are intriguing, with exotic local ingredients like dried longan fruit. Angelsshare.hk



SECRET SIPS

You'll feel a bit crazy maneuvering past the display of faux handbags down a dark alley. Sally forth! It ends at Brickhouse, a Mexico City-style street-food restaurant. The menu features authentic yet elevated street cuisine, like fatty pork-belly tacos with fiery mayo. Small-batch tequilas are buoyed by fresh juices, salt and spice.
